



Postpartum Care: Coding Guidance

The Timeliness of Prenatal & Postpartum Care (PPC) metric measures the percentage of Oregon Health Plan (OHP) members who receive postpartum care between one and 12 weeks after birth.

Umpqua Health Alliance (UHA) has identified commonly used postpartum service codes from the PPC measure specification to simplify and reduce the burden of manual reporting through chart review. These codes would need to be billed outside of the global billing process.

UHA will collect postpartum data from providers to enhance member services, with a focus on measuring the long-term health and well-being of both the birthing parent and child. Data will be captured through claims or electronic health records (EHR) charts.
