UHA: Umpqua Health Alliance is one of 16 coordinated care organizations in Oregon that has served members of the Oregon Health Plan since 2012.

Deeply rooted in Douglas County, UHA connects more than 40,000 OHP members to physical, behavioral, oral, health care through an integrated network of providers.


Proud to call the Umpqua Valley its home, UHA collaborates closely with their community partners to evaluate ongoing health care needs and issues while collaborating on local solutions.

UHA is managed through a locally based board of directors and Community Advisory Council (CAC) that ensures local health care needs are met.

Since 2018, UHA has partnered with dozens of community partners and provided over \$31,000,000 in grant funding to improve health and well-being of the community we serve.



- Application Opens: April 1, 2025
- Funding Purpose: Support community partners who would like to enroll as HRSN Service providers to deliver social needs benefit services in the areas of climate, housing, nutrition, and outreach & engagement. Look for more information coming to our website in March.

SHARE Initiative - Fall 2025

- Application Opens: Fall 2025 (Exact Date TBD)

Frequently Asked Questions: CHP Spring Funding 2025



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What is the CHP Grant?

The CHP grant is a funding opportunity provided by the UHA to support community-driven projects in our service area that address health priorities identified in the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHP).

How much funding is available & what is the typical award



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Funding availability varies each grant cycle. In 2025, UHA allocated \$750,00 for CHP funding. In this second round of CHP there is around \$350,000 remaining to fund projects. Awards can range from small grants (e.g., \$8,000-\$2000) to larger investments (\$100,000) depending on the project scope and impact.

What is the timeline for applying?

Application Release: March 1, 2025
Submission Deadline: April 15, 2025
Review Period: April 16- May 30, 2025
Award Announcements: By June 1, 2025



What are the key requirements for a successful

4 application?

A strong application should. Clearly align with CHP strategies, demonstrate measurable community impact, show collaboration with other organizations, include a well-defined budget & sustainability plan

Are there any restrictions to these funds?

s, under OAR 410-141-3845, these funds can't be used for Wages, Marketing, Covered Services for OHP members, Admin activities Workforce certification training, UHA contractual requirements, Capital



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Frequently Asked Questions: CHP Spring Funding 2025

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How can I receive an application?

In this 2nd round of funding, UHA is asking to complete a request for application found on our website. After Team Community reviews the request for compliance, we will send a link to the new Smartsheet Application.



How are applications reviewed and scored?

Applications are reviewed first by UHA and then sent to the CAC for voting and selection. Evaluations are based on alignment with CHP priorities, UHA priorities long-term impact to community, sustainability, collaboration, geographic location, indusivity, equity, clarity of measurable goals, and use evidence based onteria.



Can we apply as a partnership or coalition?

There should be a single lead applicant with active collaboration from community partners.



Is there support available if we have questions?

If successful, when can I expect funding?
